**B. Amendment: Chapter 26, Article IV, Section 26-157, to revise the definition of soil stabilization – 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading (documents are stored in 2018 Auxiliary Files)**

**AMENDMENT  
TO  
THE CODE OF MURRAY COUNTY**

**STATE OF GEORGIA**

**COUNTY OF MURRAY**

**WHEREAS**, the Commissioner of Murray County has determined that it is in the best interest of the public to amend the Murray County Code, and

**WHEREAS**, the Commissioner of Murray County finds such amendments to be useful, necessary, and proper, and protective of the environment, and the health, welfare, and safety of the public, and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT SO RESOLVED**, by the Murray County Commissioner, that the Murray County Code be amended as follows:

Under Chapter 26, Article IV, Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control, Section 26-157, Definitions, **Final Stabilization** shall be amended, and shall read as follows:

**Final Stabilization:** All soil disturbing activities at the site have been completed, and that for unpaved areas and areas not covered by permanent structures and areas located outside the waste disposal limits of a landfill cell that has been certified by EPD for waste disposal, 100% of the soil surface is uniformly covered in permanent vegetation with a density of 70% or greater, or landscaped according to the Plan (uniformly covered with landscaping materials in planned landscape areas), or equivalent permanent stabilization measures as defined in the Manual (excluding a crop of annual vegetation and seeding of target crop perennials appropriate for the region). Final stabilization applies to each phase of construction.

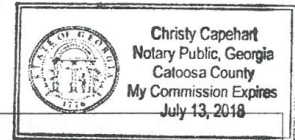

All approved funding amounts under this program are dependent on the availability of FTA funds.





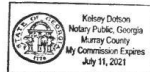

## AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION WITH THE GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, FOR A GRANT FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE UNDER SECTION 5311 OF THE FEDERAL TRANSIT LAWS UNDER CHAPTER 53 OF TITLE 49 OF THE UNITED STATES CODE.**

WHEREAS, the Federal Transit Administration and the Georgia Department of Transportation are authorized to make grant to non-urbanized areas for mass transportation projects; and

WHEREAS, the contract for financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon applicant, including the provision by it of the local share of project costs; and

WHEREAS, it is required by the United States Department of Transportation and the Georgia Department of Transportation in accord with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance under the Federal Transit Act, the applicant gives an assurance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and under the United States Department of Transportation requirements thereunder; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY MURRAY COUNTY, hereinafter referred to as the "APPLICANT",**

- That the Commissioner hereinafter referred to as the "Official" is authorized to execute and file an application on the behalf of the Applicant, a City/County government, with the Georgia Department of Transportation to aid in the financing of public transportation assistance pursuant to Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act;
- That the Official is authorized to execute and file such application and assurances or any other document required by the U.S. Department of Transportation and the Georgia Department of Transportation effectuating the purpose of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964;
- That the Official is authorized to execute and file all other standard assurances or any other document required by the Georgia Department of Transportation or the U.S. Department of Transportation in connection with the application for public transportation assistance;
- That the Official is authorized to furnish such additional information as the U.S. Department of Transportation or the Georgia Department of Transportation may require in connection with the application of the project;
- That the Official is authorized to execute grant contract agreements on behalf of the Applicant with the Georgia Department of Transportation in connection with the application for public transportation assistance;
- That the applicant while making application to or receiving grants from the Federal Transit Administration will comply with FTA Circular 9040.10, FTA Certifications and Assurances for Federal Assistance 2015 as listed in Appendix A of this application and General Operating Guidelines as illustrated in Georgia State Management Plan and Administrative Guide for Rural Public Transportation Programs;

Maddox Parkway Chatsworth, GA 30705 in the Murray County Senior Center. Days and hours of operation are Monday through Friday 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Murray Transit fleet consist of seven (7) wheel chairs assessable buses. Marketing consist of ads in the local newspaper, brochures, business cards, and word of mouth. The average one-way trip per year is around 25,000 passengers. Services are delivered through eight (8) county staffers that have multiple years of experience.






